Such exhibition was last organised last on 5th January, 2020 at Science City, Kolkata on the occassion of 44th annual get-together of the association. However, no programme could be held in 2021 and 2022 for the pandemic while the students could not participate in the programme of 2023 due to academic commitments.

The expenditures on account of to and fro journey and accomodation of the participants at Kolkata are also borne by the association.


4. SPONSORING PRIZE MONEY FOR COSMYS – 2020:

We could gather that they were getting ration of rice and wheat only but such supplies alone seldom meets the living requirements fully and driven by our concern for welfare of the persons who looked after us during the college days, we reached them with our offer of essential food items and commodities.
